

Double Work Days at Benton Beach

-- Grand Accomplishments!--

The coordinators for this year's work day, Marjorie Spalding and Carolyn Helander, tried something new. When they canvassed family members to match work teams with specific jobs, they scheduled in Saturday for those who couldn't attend Sunday. Double work days with grand accomplishments were the result.

On Saturday, May 20, the Spalding-Chemacki-Falvey contingency sanded and prepped the exterior of the Beach House for painting. It was long and tedious work. They also raked/removed flotsam from the beach and meadow, rebuilt the fireplace, refurbished the parking lot sign, installed new hinges on the outhouse door, and laid the deck tops. Forrest Helander X-braced the dock with firring strips and re-laid the deck stringer timbers.

The next day, Sunday, was another glorious day with sunshine and a ripple of breeze. Troops from the Cabrera-Collinson-Fales-Helander-Ott-Schaefer-Whelan families reported to the beach. Kasha Benton and Roger Benton, Bo

and Suzanne Huhn, and Kim Workinger also joined forces - 30 people in all. Thanks to the accomplishments made by the Saturday work party, there was unusually good spirits.

The sea air and hardy work braced up enormous appetites. A ton of sandwiches (ham n' cheese, PBJ, chicken) and all kinds of beverages and other snacks seemed to appear from nowhere. There was a gala picnic on the old beach.

Towards 5:00 p.m., the checklist of chores had been largely crossed off, including: two new coats of gleaming paint ("Seascape Green") on the Beach House, picnic table repairs, new redwood paint on most of the picnic tables, repair of the eroded lawn at the entrance of the big breakwater, extensive beach raking, replacement of four worm-eaten cedar poles in the "T" of the dock, placement of dock tops, restacking firewood, and planting the flower box geraniums.

An important prelude to Benton Beach work days was the grooming of the Road beach. Beach and Falvey Construction Co. submitted an extremely favorable estimate for delivering 1/4-inch processed stone and bulldozing sand. Matt Falvey squeezed this work into his grueling schedule (granite sea wall in Milford, CT) to accommodate our work day. David Ott coordinated the event, which coincided with the low tide on May 12. Cheryl Falvey wielded shovel and hoe, pitching in to perform critical handwork on the beach where the dozer blade could not reach.

A big thank you to all work day participants, including food contributors! Our beach is in grand shape for the '95 season, which promises to be full.
